BFA leadership attends hearing

On Friday, December 9, 2016 the National Transportation Safety Board held an inquiry regarding the July 30, 2016 balloon accident near Lockhart, Texas. BFA members Sam Parks, Andy Baird, Scott Appelman, Tony



Sandlin and Dean Carlton were called to testify during the hearing. Bert Padelt, David Rapp, and Petr Kubicek participated as representatives of Kubicek Balloons. Several members of the Federal Aviation Administration also provided testimony. The BFA was extended the opportunity to be a 'party' to the hearing, meaning the BFA had the opportunity to ask questions of the witnesses.

The hearing was broken into three sections. The first section dealt with operational issues. Witnesses were asked about standard operating procedures of a ride operation, performance differences between large and small balloons, and how weather information impacts pilot decision making.

The second section was dedicated to regulation and oversight. Questions in this panel involved FAA regulations and oversight of balloon operations, the BFA's Best Practices document, and Letters of Authorization. The work of the BFA's Professional Ride Operators was critical in being able to respond to the questioning.

The final panel related to medical factors. Questions in this panel were related to the pilot's medical conditions, the effect of certain medications, and medical certification of pilots.

The NTSB will now complete their

investigation and will determine a cause for the accident. They may additionally recommend regulatory changes to the FAA, which is usual in cases such as this. The NTSB indicated completing the investigation could take several more months.

The BFA's Call to Action committee is continuing their work regarding the report submitted to the FAA as well as the Best Practices document for balloon ride operations. We will continue to work together to enhance the safety of our sport and industry.

New website is now online

After over 3 years of work, BFA.net has a new look and a whole lot of new functionality!

The members asked for more photos, easier to find features, a simple membership application process,



easy to read Ballooning Journal online, and in general a fresh look. With this change, the BFA has moved to a development platform that is current (from a 1.5 version to a 3.6 version; which is a lot in webspeak) and will be easier to maintain. Membership billing will be completed inside the system instead of having to copy information and process it manually. BFA.net utilizes an industry standard credit card management system that is very secure (no more PayPal) and doesn't require leaving the site to make payments for membership.

Lots of people worked literally thousands of hours to make this a reality. Nancy Griffin worked very hard maintaining and updating 2 (old and new) calendars. Drew Egerton and Maury Sullivan helped significantly with the HACD portion and proof-reading. Phil Bryant and Ryan Carlton did a lot of testing as well as provide valuable input for design. A large group formed as the website committee and provided survey feedback to help with the design. Dean Carlton did the content management segment, developing the new design and incorporating lots of older articles into the new system. Also, we had a couple dozen BFA member contribute stock photographs for our use.

We all need to thank Fred Dinkler for his incredible work as our website engineer. Fred developed the new database systems, created the transfer protocol, set up the credit card system, built a custom member application system, and much, much, more. Fred has volunteered thousands of hours to the BFA in maintaining the current and new websites. Without his help, we would still be struggling.

So it is live, but it is never done. Several more enhancements are in the works. Also, with anything new there will be a few bugs. We count on our members to let us know if they find issues with the new system. We will continue to work hard to make the website as functional as we can make it.

Rules Version

The rules as posted on the BFA website will remain in force until updated by the Long Jump Committee.

Incentive to compete

Improve your duration piloting capability and flight planning skills while establishing your new "personal best" result, even if your

improvement is only 10 miles. Pilots and crew members will be entitled to boast, "I have flown my balloon "X" miles." Become familiar with weather web sites and information as you use the Long Jump program each year to challenge yourself and crew to achieve an increased distance goal and make the 'GO!' or 'NO GO!' decision. Checking the weather forecasts this winter could become a daily routine to be enjoyed as you start your day.

Do it for the crew by giving them an opportunity to be involved in a high adventure, marking the high point of a winter with otherwise few flights. Enhance crew skills in long distance chasing and recovery.

To Enter

All current BFA pilot members may enter. Entry prior to making the flight is not required. Just download and print the rules and flight report forms. Plan and complete your flight; then return the completed forms and entry fee(s). For each Long Jump season, a one-time entrance fee of \$10 for each entered BFA pilot and/ or a \$20 fee each team is required. The contest runs December 1 to March 31 of the current season.

The BFA HACD wants you to sharpen your competition ballooning skills and join the HACD this year! We are proud of what our members accomplished in 2016 including:

- Team USA's performance at the 2016 World Championship in Japan, including Rhett Heartsill the 2016 World Champion.
- Team USA's performance at the 2016 Women's World Championships in Lithuania, including Cheri White a bronze medalist.
 - Team USA's performance at the 2016 Junior World Championship in Lithuania. If flying on the World Stage is your goal, the HACD welcomes you to join and sharpen your skills.

We are also proud to have had two successful US National Championships in 2016 – one in Shreveport, LA and the other, the first standalone US Women's National Championships in Albuquerque, NM. In 2017 the HACD looks forward to another successful US Nationals in Shreveport, LA and will continue to search for organizers of US National Championships – Women's, Jr's and Team Nationals to promote the sport and allow members to sharpen skills.

We continue to be thankful for all the balloon events that support competitive ballooning in the USA and use our rules/regulations and allow their pilots to compete for points in our National Eligibility List. Though not final, as of this writing 39 different events had scores submitted into the National Eligibility List.

Many more events had intentions to submit scores, but were weathered out. It is these events, ranging from small balloon club events, to large competitive events which are the lifeblood of our division. We attempt to add value to organizers by having a published rule book, scoring software, safety standards, etc. available to organizers with very little extra work needed to have scores submitted to our National Eligibility List.

Help us grow competitive ballooning and consider having your event submit scores to the National Eligibility List. Although the name of the list is a bit deceiving, pilots don't have to have an interest in flying at Nationals to be listed and have points submitted. The HACD recognizes the top pilot on the National Eligibility List as well as the top senior pilot, top woman pilot, top rookie pilot, top Jr. pilot, and the most improved pilot from the previous year list. Any organizers who wish to have their scores submitted for the 2017 National Eligibility List should visit the BFA website to learn how.

The HACD Board of Directors held their annual face to face meeting in December 2016 to discuss the year that was in 2016 as well as plan and approve rule changes for 2017. There are many new and exciting things in the works that will debut in 2017, join us and see!
