Crewing Quips

The BFA Board recognizes the importance of crew in our sport, and in our organization. In an effort to provide more crew-focused content, we will be providing some "Crew Quips" for tips, advice and fun stories. This month's Crew Quips are once again submitted by BFA Board Secretary Dean Carton!

CQ #1 - What not to wear

It's hot out there, which changes our ballooning apparel. However, safety must trump fashion. That retrieve through the tall grass with the poison ivy while wearing your shorts will remind you to wear long pants next time. Nylon shirts can melt if too close to the flame and cause serious burns. Open toed shoes or sandals are not a good idea either. If you have long hair, tie it back - especially around the fan. Sunblock and bug spray (keep them in your truck) and a hat can be very helpful. Dress for success (and safety)!

CQ #2 - Stock the truck

A rainy day is a good time to check what you carry in your vehicle. A moderate non-expired first aid kit (with Band-Aids), flashlight, tow strap, bug spray, maps, sunscreen, lots of gloves, and helium (with pibals) should be in there. Also a tank full of fuel is a good idea BEFORE the flight. A notebook showing where everything is located, important phone numbers, and other paper-based information is also a good idea.
