The 19<sup>th</sup> America's Challenge is set to take to the skies on Saturday, October 4<sup>th</sup> from Balloon Fiesta Park in Albuquerque.

## *Crewing Quips*

The BFA Board recognizes the importance of crew in our sport, and in our organization. In an effort to provide more crew-focused content, we will be providing some "Crew Quips" for tips, advice and fun stories. This month's Crew Quips are once again submitted by BFA Board Secretary Dean Carton!

### *CQ #1 – Don't Get Burned*

Many balloon systems can be inflated to the point where the throat will stay open without help. With proper pressure from the crown line operator(s), some balloons do not require people at the throat during hot inflate. If crew don't need to be there, they can drop off and put weight on the basket instead when instructed by the pilot just before going hot. Check with your pilot to see if this method will work with your system.

### *CQ #2 – It Takes 2 to Tango*

A way to gain more control of the balloon during inflation is to use 2 crown lines. The lines are positioned at 90 degrees from each other, so that the crown lines and the balloon form a "Y" shape, with the basket at the bottom of the "Y". With 2 people, the rolling effect is significantly reduced. For glows, keep the 2 crown line persons out, but after inflating position them upwind at 90 degrees from each other.
