





Do you know how the ADS-B regulations apply to LTA?

Many of us have not heard about the ADS-B regulation that took effect at 12:01 a.m. January 1, 2020, it is not without confusion to how it applies to LTA community. In researching for this article, it was found more than one perception of how it applies to balloons. After confirmation of the facts it was found that *The Balloon Training Academy* has the clearest explanation of how it affects balloons. If your regular flight area is within or around Class C airspace, please contact your local tower to see what they expect.

The Young Guns competition debuted at the 2019 Great Texas Balloon Race in Longview, Texas, with six up-and-coming pilots who competed alongside their more-seasoned colleagues. This year's event, June 19 to 21, 2020, will be a partnership with GTBR Young Guns and the Balloon Federation of America to present the Junior Nationals giving up to 15 Young Gun pilots to take the skies for a chance to win prize money but with considerations made for their experience level.

The goal of the Young Guns competition and Junior Nationals is to introduce newer and younger pilots to competitive ballooning and do it at an event world-renowned for hosting a top-of-its-class competition in what will be its 43rd year.

To qualify for the Young Guns competition, pilots must hold an LTA certificate and be 29 years of age or younger on the first day of scheduled flights.

To help accommodate for experience level of the Young Gun pilots, they are allowed time after the pilot briefing each morning to ask questions of race officials after other pilots have left the meeting. Young Gun pilots will run the same tasks as the other pilots at the Great Texas Balloon Race; however, if a Young Gun pilot misses a target, they will still be scored based on their logger. Young Gun pilots will also take part in the balloon glow at the Great Texas Balloon Race lighting up the night sky for awe-struck onlookers in East Texas, where the balloon glow originated.

If you are or know a young or new-to-the-sport balloon pilot be sure to encourage them to apply to be a part of this cuttingedge event that is helping usher in the next generation of competitive balloon pilots.

LAST MONTHS QUIZ & ANSWER

Question: At what altitude is supplemental oxygen required for the Pilot in Command?

Answer: FAR 91.211

- (a) General. No person may operate a civil aircraft of U.S. registry—
- (1) At cabin pressure altitudes above 12,500 feet (MSL) up to and including 14,000 feet (MSL) unless the required minimum flight crew is provided with and uses supplemental oxygen for that part of the flight at those altitudes that is of more than 30 minutes duration;
- (2) At cabin pressure altitudes above 14,000 feet (MSL) unless the required minimum flight crew is provided with and uses supplemental oxygen during the entire flight time at those altitudes; and
- (3) At cabin pressure altitudes above 15,000 feet (MSL) unless each occupant of the aircraft is provided with supplemental oxygen.
