

Southeastern Region news...

BFA President Pat Cannon has announced that Dave Sullivan, of Fayetteville, Georgia has been appointed to fill the remaining term of the Southeastern BFA Board position. Dave is a longtime member of the ballooning community, and currently owns and operates Balloonacy, ltd, one of the last remaining certificated repair facilities in the Southeast. In conjunction with his daughter, Alyssa, he also provides parts and assemblies for the remaining Aerostar balloons worldwide. For the last five years, Dave has also been the Western Hemisphere distributor for Digitool flight instruments, used worldwide in hot air balloons.

Dave has served as a Designated Pilot Examiner for lighter than air aircraft in the Southeast for the past eighteen years. He has previously operated a 141 school for balloon flight training and has a significant background in flight training. Dave has provided flight training and maintenance support to the Southeastern Balloon Camp over the past two years.

Update on Drones Activity

Many of you have a growing concern about the increase in drone activities in your area. The growth of the number of companies that have obtained an operations certificate, better known as an FAR 135 Certificate is something to take note of. These companies have been authorized by their certificate to operate over areas in and near many major metropolitan areas, many of which overlay areas of ballooning activity. The BFA has received copies of several regulatory waivers that are being issued to these drone operators for operations Beyond Visual Line of Sight (BVLOS) by the FAA. However, there is some good news attached to these approvals. Every one of them causes the drone operators to detect and avoid (DAA) and cleverly states that the pilot and company are responsible for avoiding all manned aircraft. This includes balloons.

They are not being given right of way in any of the cases brought to our attention, so the work of not only the BFA but of all of our partners in both sport and business aviation have had the desired effect with our comments to the Aviation Rulemaking Committee that any relief by the FAA to these drone operators by allowing them any right of way would seriously increase the likelihood of a midair collision and injury to passengers and crew. In addition, pilots of these drones are required to have both a pilot certificate and an aviation medical. Visual Observers (VOs) along the flight routes are required unless they can prove that they have other means of securing the safety of all other manned aircraft or that the drone is equipped with "DAA" equipment.

One word of caution: We should not get complacent in violations of 91.119, which requires us to be at or above 500 feet AGL or not closer than 500 feet from persons, building, etc., except for takeoff and landing. Drones are in the airspace below 400 feet AGL. That is their maximum allowable altitude. The BFA is actively involved with at least one of these major drone operators to solve the problem of visibility to them while we are flying and a full article will be written about these efforts in an upcoming Ballooning Magazine article.

Marlene Wall was presented the BFA Director's Award by Mark West.



There are ground schools for pilots, so why not crew members? That's the question the Albuquerque Aerostat Ascension Association (AAAA) asked recently and then set about to create one. Following on the heels of AAAA's recent success with built-for-online private and commercial pilot ground schools, there is now an online course for Crew.

In this course, you'll get an in-depth look at what it takes to be a great crew member of a balloon team. You'll also get a brief introduction to the BFA's Crew Achievement Program which could be easily completed with the skills learned through this course.

Designed for newbies and experienced crew of all levels, our team of instructors will walk you through every aspect you might encounter when participating on a crew. Some activities you'll experience every day. Others you may never experience, but if you do, you'll be ready for them.

As you proceed through the 16 modules, you'll be introduced to the fundamentals, experience a typical balloon flight, learn how to tie what knots when, learn about the different types of balloons systems, experience a chase, learn what needs to be in the chase truck as well as what the crew should be doing in the truck. You'll also learn what it takes to be the crew chief, how to use the radio properly, and deal with landowners when the pilot isn't available. You'll be exposed to weather fundamentals that will help you understand what your pilot is looking at when deciding whether to fly and to predict where they might land. You'll learn about the proper handling of propane and explore those special operations like tethers and static displays. While you may never need it, you'll learn basic first aid and firefighting skills. It all wraps up with a final exam so you can be assured you have learned and understand the material.

The instructors are long-time pilots and crew chiefs and each session is beautifully illustrated with pictures, videos, and captivating animations.

You can complete the entire course in about 4 hours or spread your learning out for up to two months.

The online AAAA Chase Crew Course is now available for purchase directly from the AAAA website at <u>https://tinyurl.com/3etmak2u</u> The cost of the program for AAAA members is \$15.00 and \$30.00 for nonmembers.

Balloonists from all over the northeast and beyond are extremely excited that the Adirondack Balloon Festival will be celebrating its 50th anniversary September 21-25, 2023. The Adirondack Balloon Festival was founded in 1972 by Walter Grishkot and his wife Joan. They spent the rest of their lives organizing this great balloon festival. Mark Donahue now serves as the event President.

To celebrate this milestone the festival will hold a pre-festival Cocktail Reception and Moonglow on Wednesday evening the 20th. On Thursday, a parade begins in downtown Glens Falls, NY and ends at Crandall Park just before the festival's first launch. The festival will then move to the Floyd Bennett Memorial Airport in Queensbury, NY for the rest of the weekend. This year the festival will also host a record number of special shapes. Saturday and Sunday mornings will feature for the first time a Dawn Patrol flight prior to the mass ascension. On Thursday at noon the Pioneers of Ballooning Luncheon will take place at the festival's original location at the Adirondack Community College.

The Adirondack Balloon Festival hopes to have up to 99 balloons this year. This festival has become the third largest festival in the United States following Albuquerque and Reno. In addition to the balloons there will be a large craft show, food trucks, other vendors and live music throughout the festival weekend.

On behalf of the Balloon Federation of America I would like to wish the Adirondack Balloon Festival a happy 50th anniversary and toast to a successful and memorable event.
