## Scott Appelman





It is with great sadness that we learned of the untimely passing of our friend Scott Appelman. Scott was a respected and valuable ally of the Balloon Federation of America. Most recently he served his fellow balloonists as a member of the BFA's Call to Action Committee. There he worked on a variety of projects including safety recommendations in the aftermath of the tragic ballooning accident in Lockhart, Texas. He was also instrumental in working with the FAA to initiate a program whereby, through a Letter of Authorization, balloons are allowed to fly in controlled Class C airspace without ADS-B. Some years earlier, Scott urged the BFA to organize a Professional Ride Operators division and then became its first director. That division today still uses the document he developed, the Envelope of Safety, as PRO's guide to operating a ride business. Scott's passion for safety and professionalism, best exhibited through his company, Rainbow Ryders, is an example that balloonists nationwide would do well to adopt.

We will miss Scott and his determined leadership. He will always be remembered by the BFA as an inspiration and a driving force in our effort to better the sport of ballooning.

We would like to extend out condolences to Heather and their entire family for their loss.

The FAA has published new Practical Test Standards/PTS to be used for both Private and Commercial LTA Checkrides. The old Private and Commercial PTS with effective dates of 1996 and 1997 are no longer current.

Summary of changes: Updated References to current documents and practices, mainly in the Introduction Sections. There are very few changes in Lighter-Than-Air Balloon Sections. But you need to be using these for your checkrides NOW!

The BFA National Convention will be held in Dayton, OH on March 28-29, 2025, at the Dayton Convention Center. Penny Suttle, BFA Director Great Lakes Region states that planning is moving along, and the committee is working towards booking speakers and trade show vendors.

Dayton, Ohio is easily accessible from I75 or I70. The Dayton Convention Center is very convenient with a parking garage and walkway to the center itself. The University Marriott is only about a mile from the convention center with ample parking available.

Dayton International Airport (DAY) is only 15 miles to the north and is served by nine airlines including American, United, Allegiant and Delta. Major car rental companies are also located at DAY. The Cincinnati Airport (CVG) also services the area and is about an hour south of Dayton.

The BFA has blocked rooms at a rate of \$155/night starting Thurs March 25<sup>th</sup> thru Sat. March 29<sup>th</sup>. A Welcome Reception will be held at the National Museum of the US Air Force Thursday evening.


